HORTON FARMS



The first of six generations of Hortons settled in Glastonbury, CT on the banks of the Connecticut River. With business beginning in historic 1860, the farm began with no more than a red barn and quaint farmhouse, both of which remain in existence today.

Along with these antiques, Ken Horton and his family expanded the Horton Farms to include a total of seven barns set on 35 acres of land. Throughout the farm's unprecedented 250 years of production the Hortons have grown tomatoes, butternut squash, dairy, and tobacco.

Today the family continues to grow the finest tomatoes, excellent butternut squash, and superior broadleaf tobacco. With the Connecticut River flood plains as the farm's ally, Horton Farms is

home to the finest soil around and is a picturesque illustration of the pride that the Horton family takes in its production of exceptional produce. So picturesque in fact, in 1993 the farm welcomed singer-songwriter Billy Joel to film the music video for his famous top ten hit "River of Dreams" on site in one of their antique red barns.
