

CTR Program Rules & Expectations

1 Carabiner Clip = 1 CTR Container, exchange at Gwinn cashier when you want a to-go meal. Soiled CTR containers can be returned for a clip at the following cashier stations: Gwinn Commons Dining Hall, C-store and Bertona St. Grill.

The Simple Servings Station (low allergen station) should be the customer's first stop, as the server can dish directly into the empty container, avoiding cross-contamination and an extra plate.

Customers using a CTR container are to collect their meal into the container and exit the dining hall. They cannot dine in the dining hall.

Patrons can pay for a meal, dine in the dining hall, and then return to the cashier to pay for a to-go meal to take a meal out of the dining hall.

For health and safety concerns, only clean and sanitized CTR containers issued from the cashier will be allowed in the dining hall.

If you lose, break or damage your clip or container, you can pay \$5 to receive a new one.

Breaking the Rules = Privileges Revoked

- Violation of the rules and expectations from the Student Handbook.
- Taking other beverages to-go from the dining hall other than water.
- Filling your container with an excess amount of food to where the box does not close.
- Not selecting a meal, but selecting excess multiples of an item (ex: 20 cookies, 10 pieces of chicken, etc.)
- Using your own personal container in Gwinn Commons Dining Hall.
- Filling up your container and not exiting the dining hall.
- Not using an approved clip or container from Dining Services.
